


**VILLAGE OF RED HOOK
PUBLIC HEARING
SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL
4-30-09**

The Village of Red Hook received a short environmental assessment for Safe Routes to School, which would provide sidewalks along the south side of West Market Street, new crosswalks and side ramps at the intersections of: South Broadway and Fraleigh, South Broadway and Prince Street, North Broadway in front of the Post Office – 100 feet north of Saint James Street. This project would also include two blinking beacons (Middle School and High School). The Village was awarded these funds from stimulus money (\$ 230,000.00). Some stipulations with the granting of these funds are union only, and made in the USA only. Mr. Lynch stated the importance of a crosswalk being added to Linden Ave. Mr. Day feels there are some funds left over to strip this crosswalk. These funds will be awarded by the end of June and the completion of this job should take no more than 30 days. Trustee Blundell suggested adding speed control to the blinking beacons. Mr. Day can include an add alternate to the project.

Trustee Trapp made a motion to close the public hearing. Trustee Kovalchik seconded. All were in favor.
