REGULAR BOARD MEETING MINUTES
December 18, 2024**

A meeting of the Village Board of Trustees was held on December 18, 2024 at the Historic Watts DePeyster Hall, Tivoli, NY. Mayor Griffith opened the regular meeting at 7:00 PM.

The Mayor asked all present at the meeting to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Clerk's report included:

- 413 Trash tags sold
- Two payrolls were processed by Village Treasurer, Bonnie Day
- Deputy Clerk/Planning & Zoning Secretary, Bonnie Day, has been working with the Planning Board lately, and there is a potential upcoming project with the Zoning Board of Appeals
- The Village Clerk's Office will be Closed on Wednesday, December 25, 2024 to observe the Christmas holiday, and Wednesday, January 1, 2025 to observe New Year's Day
- Clerk Bruno mentioned Tivoli Fire Company, and considering her involvement, it was a busy year. She will be working with FEMA to close out a grant, and looking into others. She thanked everyone who donated to the Toys For Tots campaign, it was a great success. On behalf of TFD, Clerk Bruno thanked Janett, and her staff, of Hotel Tivoli/The Corner for a wonderful evening on Monday, December 16. The fire department appreciates their yearly invitation to dinner, along with their hospitality and continued support.
- Clerk Bruno spoke of what a pleasure it was to be a part of a number of events with the gentlemen of the American Legion this past year, and she looks forward to attending their event on Friday, December 20, 2024.
- The solar project at Provoost Park has progressed, and work will begin mid-January, so in 3-4 weeks, and should take about 3 weeks to complete. Clerk Bruno is looking forward to the project, and its completion.
- On behalf of Bonnie Day, and Clerk Bruno, the Clerk sent wishes to village residents for happy and safe holidays.

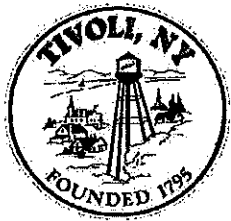
Public Comment

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SCHEDULED MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT FOR
VILLAGE HALL GENERATOR**

WHEREAS, the Village is seeking to enter into a scheduled maintenance agreement with Gentech, LTD in order to annually service the generator at the rate of \$505 a visit; and

WHEREAS, the Village has determined that it is in the best interests of the Village to enter into such an agreement on the terms and conditions specified in such agreement in the form on file with the Village Clerk ("Agreement"); and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Tivoli, Dutchess County, New York (by the favorable vote of not less than a majority of all of the members of the Board) as follows:

1. BOND RESOLUTION DATED JANUARY 15, 2025

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING FIREHOUSE RENOVATION AND EXPANSION PROJECT AT AN ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST OF \$6,150,706 AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SERIAL BONDS OF THE VILLAGE OF TIVOLI, DUTCHESS COUNTY, NEW YORK IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$5,431,706 PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL FINANCE LAW TO FINANCE A PORTION OF SUCH COST, PROVIDING THAT THIS RESOLUTION SHALL BE SUBJECT TO PERMISSIVE REFERENDUM, AND DELEGATING CERTAIN POWERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH TO THE TREASURER

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Village Board of the Village of Tivoli, Dutchess County, New York (the "Village") (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all of the members of the Board) as follows:

SECTION 1. The specific purpose (hereinafter referred to as "purpose") to be financed pursuant to this resolution is the renovation and expansion of the Village's firehouse. The estimated maximum cost of said purpose is \$6,150,706 and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. It is hereby determined that said purpose is an object or purpose described in subdivision 91 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, and that the period of probable usefulness of said purpose is fifteen years.

SECTION 2. The aforesaid purpose constitutes a Type I action as defined under the State Environmental Quality Review Regulations, 6 NYCRR Part 617, which has been determined in accordance with SEQRA not to have a significant impact on the environment.

SECTION 3. The Village Board plans to finance a portion of the cost of said purpose by the issuance of serial bonds of the Village in an amount not to exceed \$5,431,706 hereby authorized to be issued therefor pursuant to the Local Finance Law. The Village expects to pay or reimburse the remaining costs from the proceeds of certain grants and other available funds.

SECTION 4. It is hereby determined that the proposed maturity of the serial bonds authorized hereby will be in excess of five years.

SECTION 5. Current funds are not required to be provided prior to the issuance of the bonds authorized by this resolution or any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds.

SECTION 6. The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be applied to reimburse the Village for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose for which said bonds are authorized. This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Sec 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations.

SECTION 7. Each of the bonds authorized by this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law. The faith and credit of the Village are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds becoming due and payable in such year. To the extent not paid from other sources, there shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of the Village a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same become due and payable.

SECTION 8. Subject to the terms and contents of this resolution and the Local Finance Law, and pursuant to the provisions of Sections 30.00, 50.00 and 56.00 to 63.00, inclusive, of said Law, the power to authorize bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance of the serial bonds authorized by this resolution and the renewals of said notes and the power to prescribe the terms, form and contents of said serial bonds and said bond anticipation notes (including without limitation the date, denominations, maturities, interest payment dates, consolidation with other issues, and redemption rights), the power to determine to issue said bonds providing for substantially level or declining debt service, and the power to sell and deliver said serial bonds, (including statutory installment bonds), and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of such bonds, is hereby delegated to the Treasurer, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the Village. The Treasurer is hereby authorized to sign any serial bonds issued pursuant to this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of said serial bonds, and the Clerk is hereby authorized to affix the corporate seal of the Village to any of said serial bonds or any bond anticipation notes and to attest such seal.

SECTION 9. The Treasurer is further authorized to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to ensure the continued status of the interest on the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, as excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and, to the extent applicable, to designate the bonds authorized by this resolution and any notes issued in anticipation thereof as "qualified tax-exempt bonds" for purposes of Section 265(b)(3)(B)(I) of the Code.

SECTION 10. Pursuant to Section 36 of the Local Finance Law and Article 9 of the Village Law, this resolution shall take effect thirty (30) days after adoption, unless there shall be filed with the Village Clerk a petition signed and acknowledged by the electors of the Village in number equal to at least twenty percentum of such electors in the Village, as shown on the register of electors for the previous general village election, protesting against this resolution and requesting that the matter be submitted to the electors of the Village for their approval or disapproval in the manner provided by the Village Law.

SECTION 11. Within ten (10) days after the adoption of this resolution, the Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause to be published at least once in the Daily Freeman, the official newspaper of the Village, and to be posted in at least six (6) public places in the Village, a notice which shall set forth the date of adoption of this resolution and contain an abstract thereof, concisely stating its purpose and effect and specifying that this resolution was adopted subject to a permissive referendum.

SECTION 12. The validity of said serial bonds or of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said serial bonds may be contested only if:

(1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the Village is not authorized to expend money; or

(2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with;

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication; or

(3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution of New York.

SECTION 13. Following the effective date of this resolution, the Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish this resolution, or a summary thereof, together with a notice in substantially the form provided by Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law, in the Daily Freeman, a newspaper having a general circulation in the Village and hereby designated as the official newspaper of the Village for such publication.
